I oversee all the Livingwell developments in the west. This means I work alongside the team leaders and the development co-

ordinator to ensure we are providing a service that meets the needs of our customers. No two days are the same in Livingwell. It is a fastpaced and exciting service to work in.

What's one thing staff would be surprised to know about Livingwell?

Some of our customers are actually really young and still work! Although we are a service for older people, anyone from the age of 55 can live in our developments.

I think this is an accurate representation of the population, as people are working and remaining active well into their 60s and 70s. The new developments attract people as they provide safe, secure, high-spec accommodation which is energy efficient as well as having social areas inside and outside.

What's the best thing about your job?

Seeing customers get the most out of life - whether that is in their home, engaging in activities, living life to the full or being amazed at what they can do. Our recent collaboration with SWG3, where customers had graffiti art sessions, was the best example of this. It really showed that age is just a number and we need to, as a society, ensure that we are continuing to challenge stereotypes around age. Livingwell Team Leader Kim McWilliams said: "The tenants had a great time showing off their own designs and creating a masterpiece to celebrate the fifth birthday of Livingwell.

LIVINGWELL tenants from Auchinlea Gardens in Glasgow have worked together to brighten their communal garden. Around eight residents planted



BOGUS callers try to get into your home or get personal details by pretending to be someone they're not.



council staff, charity collectors, meter readers and police officers. In reality, they are criminals trying to steal money and valuables.

Rogue traders usually cold-call. They claim to be workers offering services such as making

repairs or carrying out work on your property. In reality they charge inflated prices for shoddy work that isn't needed.

We do not recommend dealing with coldcallers. Top tips to keep safe include:

- Be on guard if someone turns up unexpectedly
- Keep front and back doors locked
- If you're not sure, don't answer the door
- Don't feel embarrassed genuine callers expect you to be careful
- Only let callers in if they have an appointment
 confirm they are genuine
- If you're not sure, don't answer the door.


